New Testament Reading

Revelation 7.9-end

After this I looked, and there was a great
multitude that no one could count, from
every nation, from all tribes and peoples
and languages, standing before the throne
and before the Lamb, robed in white, with

palm branches in their hands. ¹⁰They cried
out in a loud voice, saying,

'Salvation belongs to our God who is
seated on the throne, and to the Lamb!'

¹¹And all the angels stood around the
throne and around the elders and the four
living creatures, and they fell on their
faces before the throne and worshipped
God, ¹²singing,

'Amen! Blessing and glory and wisdom
and thanksgiving and honour

Profession of Faith

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy,
always and everywhere to give you
thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal
God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. And
now we give you thanks, most gracious
God, surrounded by a great cloud of
witnesses and glorified in the assembly of
your saints. The glorious company of
apostles praise you. The noble fellowship
of prophets praise you. The white-robed
army of martyrs praise you. We, your holy
Church, acclaim you. In communion with
angels and archangels, and with all who
served you on earth and worship you now

in heaven, we raise our voice to proclaim your glory, for ever praising you and saying:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of
the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

All glory be to you, our heavenly Father, who, in your tender mercy, gave your only Son our Saviour Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there by his one oblation of himself once offered a full, perfect and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; he instituted, and in his holy gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death until he comes again.

Hear us, merciful Father, we humbly pray, and grant that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, we receiving these gifts of your creation, this bread and this wine, according to your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ's holy institution, in remembrance of his death and passion, may be partakers of his most blessed body and blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Great is the mystery of faith.

**All: Christ has died,
Christ is risen,
Christ will come again.**

Therefore, Lord and heavenly Father, in remembrance of the precious death and passion, the mighty resurrection and glorious ascension of your dear Son Jesus Christ, we offer you through him this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Grant that by his merits and death, and through faith in his blood, we and all your Church may receive forgiveness of our sins and all other benefits of his passion. Although we are unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer you any sacrifice, yet we pray that you will accept this the duty and service that we owe. Do not weigh our merits, but pardon our offences, and fill us all who share in this holy communion with your grace and heavenly blessing; through Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory be yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
