The Liturgy of the Word

Old Testament Reading

Job 42:1-6, 10-17

Then Job replied to the Lord:

² 'I know that you can do all things;
no purpose of yours can be thwarted.

³ You asked, "Who is this that obscures
my plans without knowledge?"

Surely I spoke of things I did not
understand,
things too wonderful for me to know.

⁴ 'You said, "Listen now, and I will speak;
I will question you,
and you shall answer me."

⁵ My ears had heard of you
but now my eyes have seen you.

⁶ Therefore I despise myself
and repent in dust and ashes.'

¹⁰ After Job had prayed for his friends,
the Lord restored his fortunes and gave
him twice as much as he had before. ¹¹ All
his brothers and sisters and everyone who
had known him before came and ate with
him in his house. They comforted and
consoled him over all the trouble
the Lord had brought on him, and each
one gave him a piece of silver and a gold
ring.

¹² The Lord blessed the latter part of Job's
life more than the former part. He had
fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand
camels, a thousand yoke of oxen and a
thousand donkeys. ¹³ And he also had
seven sons and three daughters. ¹⁴ The
first daughter he named Jemimah, the
second Keziah and the third Keren-
Happuch. ¹⁵ Nowhere in all the land were
there found women as beautiful as Job's
daughters, and their father granted them
an inheritance along with their brothers.
¹⁶ After this, Job lived a hundred and forty
years; he saw his children and their
children to the fourth generation. ¹⁷ And
so Job died, an old man and full of years.

New Testament Reading

Hebrews 7:23-28

²³ Now there have been many of those
priests, since death prevented them from
continuing in office; ²⁴ but because Jesus
lives for ever, he has a permanent
priesthood. ²⁵ Therefore he is able to save
completely those who come to God
through him, because he always lives to
intercede for them.

²⁶ Such a high priest truly meets our
need – one who is holy, blameless, pure,
set apart from sinners, exalted above the
heavens. ²⁷ Unlike the other high priests,
he does not need to offer sacrifices day
after day, first for his own sins, and then
for the sins of the people. He sacrificed
for their sins once for all when he offered
himself. ²⁸ For the law appoints as high
priests men in all their weakness; but the
oath, which came after the law, appointed
the Son, who has been made perfect for
ever.

Mark 10:46-52

⁴⁶ Then they came to Jericho. As Jesus
and his disciples, together with a large
crowd, were leaving the city, a blind man,
Bartimaeus (which means 'son of
Timaeus'), was sitting by the roadside
begging. ⁴⁷ When he heard that it was
Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout,
'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!'

⁴⁸ Many rebuked him and told him to be
quiet, but he shouted all the more, 'Son of
David, have mercy on me!'

⁴⁹ Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him.'
So they called to the blind man, 'Cheer
up! On your feet! He's calling
you.' ⁵⁰ Throwing his cloak aside, he
jumped to his feet and came to Jesus.

⁵¹ 'What do you want me to do for
you?' Jesus asked him.
The blind man said, 'Rabbi, I want to see.'
⁵² 'Go,' said Jesus, 'your faith has healed
you.' Immediately he received his sight
and followed Jesus along the road.

Profession of Faith

**We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,

He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Liturgy of the Sacrament

The Peace

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right and good, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. For he is your eternal and creative Word, through whom all things came into being; the Word made flesh who dwelt among us, full of grace and truth. He fulfils the Law and the Prophets, dying for our sins and rising again in accordance with the Scriptures. He stands among us in his risen power, opening to us his living word, and making himself known in the breaking of the bread. Therefore with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we proclaim your great and glorious name, for ever praising you and singing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
God of power and might,
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ, and as we follow his example and obey his command, grant that by the power of your Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine may be to us his body and his blood; who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith.

**All: Christ has died,
Christ is risen,
Christ will come again.**

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

**All: Blessing and honour and glory
and power be yours for ever and
ever. Amen.**

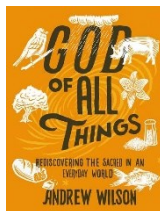
