## The Liturgy of the Word

### Old Testament Reading

Deuteronomy 30:9-14

<sup>9</sup> Then the Lord your God will make you most prosperous in all the work of your hands and in the fruit of your womb, the young of your livestock and the crops of your land. The Lord will again delight in you and make you prosperous, just as he delighted in your ancestors, <sup>10</sup> if you obey the Lord your God and keep his commands

and decrees that are written in this Book of the Law and turn to the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul.

<sup>11</sup> Now what I am commanding you today is not too difficult for you or beyond your reach. <sup>12</sup> It is not up in heaven, so that you have to ask, 'Who will ascend into heaven to get it and proclaim it to us so that we may obey it?' <sup>13</sup> Nor is it beyond the sea, so that you have to ask, 'Who will cross the sea to get it and proclaim it to us so that we may obey it?' <sup>14</sup> No, the word is very near you; it is in your mouth and in your heart so that you may obey it.

## New Testament Reading

### Colossians 1:1-14

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Timothy our brother,

<sup>2</sup>To God's holy people in Colossae, the faithful brothers and sisters in Christ: Grace and peace to you from God our Father.

<sup>3</sup>We always thank God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, when we pray for you, <sup>4</sup>because we have heard of your faith in Christ Jesus and of the love you have for all God's people – <sup>5</sup>the faith and love that spring from the hope stored up for you in heaven and about which you have already heard in the true message of the gospel <sup>6</sup>that has come to you. In the same way, the gospel is bearing fruit and growing throughout the whole world – just as it has been doing among you since the day you heard it and truly understood God's grace. <sup>7</sup>You learned it from Epaphras, our dear fellow servant, who is a faithful minister of Christ on our behalf, <sup>8</sup>and who also told us of your love in the Spirit.

<sup>9</sup>For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you. We continually ask God to fill you with the knowledge of his will through all the wisdom and understanding that the Spirit gives, <sup>10</sup>so that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God, <sup>11</sup>being strengthened with all power according to his glorious might so that you may have great endurance and patience, <sup>12</sup>and giving joyful thanks to the Father, who has qualified you to share in the inheritance of his holy people in the kingdom of light. <sup>13</sup>For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, <sup>14</sup>in whom

we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins.

Reader: This is the word of the Lord.

### John 10:11-21

<sup>11</sup>'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. <sup>12</sup>The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. <sup>13</sup>The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. <sup>14</sup>'I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me – <sup>15</sup>just as the Father knows me and I know the Father – and I lay down my life for the sheep. <sup>16</sup>I have other sheep that are not of this sheepfold. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. <sup>17</sup>The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life – only to take it up again. <sup>18</sup>No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father.' <sup>19</sup>The Jews who heard these words were again divided. <sup>20</sup>Many of them said, 'He is demon-possessed and raving mad. Why listen to him?'

<sup>21</sup>But others said, 'These are not the sayings of a man possessed by a demon. Can a demon open the eyes of the blind?'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

*9. I am the good shepherd*

### **Profession of Faith**

We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is, seen and unseen.

worshipped and glorified,  
who has spoken through the prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic and  
apostolic Church.

We look for the resurrection of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## The Eucharistic Prayer

The Lord be with you.

All: **And also with you.**

Lift up your hearts.

All: **We lift them to the Lord.**

Let us give thanks  
to the Lord our God

All: **It is right to give thanks  
and praise.**

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God. From sunrise to sunset this day is holy, for Christ has risen from the tomb and scattered the darkness of death with light that will not fade. This day the risen Lord walks with your gathered people, unfolds for us your word, and makes himself known in the breaking of the bread. And though the night will overtake this day you summon us to live in endless light, the never-ceasing sabbath of the Lord. And so, with choirs of angels and with all the heavenly host, we proclaim your glory and join their unending song of praise:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord,  
God of power and might,  
heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the  
Lord. Hosanna in the highest.**

Accept our praises, heavenly Father,  
through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ,  
and as we follow his example and obey his  
command, grant that by the power of your  
Holy Spirit these gifts of bread and wine  
may be to us his body and his blood; who, in  
the same night that he was betrayed, took  
bread and gave you thanks; he broke it and

gave it to his disciples, saying: Take, eat;  
this is my body which is given for you; do  
this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the  
cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to  
them, saying: Drink this, all of you; this is  
my blood of the new covenant, which is  
shed for you and for many for the  
forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you  
drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember  
his offering of himself made once for all  
upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty  
resurrection and glorious ascension; we  
look for the coming of your kingdom, and  
with this bread and this cup we make the  
memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Great is the mystery of faith.

All: **Christ has died,  
Christ is risen,  
Christ will come again.**

Accept through him, our great high priest,  
this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and  
as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the  
presence of your divine majesty, renew us  
by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and  
unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus  
Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him,  
in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who  
stand before you in earth and heaven, we  
worship you, Father almighty, in songs of  
everlasting praise:

All: **Blessing and honour and glory and  
power be yours for ever and ever.  
Amen.**
